

- ① Wild Boar Ridge Campground (Open late Spring - Summer)
- ② Connector to Lake Shore trail behind horseshoe pit.
- ③ Connector to Lake Shore trail at end of campground loop.
- ④ At the bridge, the Telleck Branch connector to the right leads to Trace Creek and Middle Fork sections of the Ozark Trail. A reroute of the connector, which bypasses the area flooded by the beaver dam was completed in Sept. 2006.
- ⑤ After crossing the bridge, the trail goes left and through a creek crossing. Crosses the road at the Enough boat ramp, and heads off into the woods on the far side of the boat launch area.
- ⑥ Trail crosses the dam, follows doubletrack up the hill for a short distance, and then heads into the woods on the left.
- ⑦ Trail goes through creek crossing and joins gravel road leading toward swim beach.
- ⑧ Swim Beach. Trail joins asphalt here, goes between buildings for showers, veers to the left past a few picnic sites, where it can again be picked up at the carsonite sign right before a creek crossing.
- ⑨ Trail goes through boat ramp parking lot, and continues on opposite side.

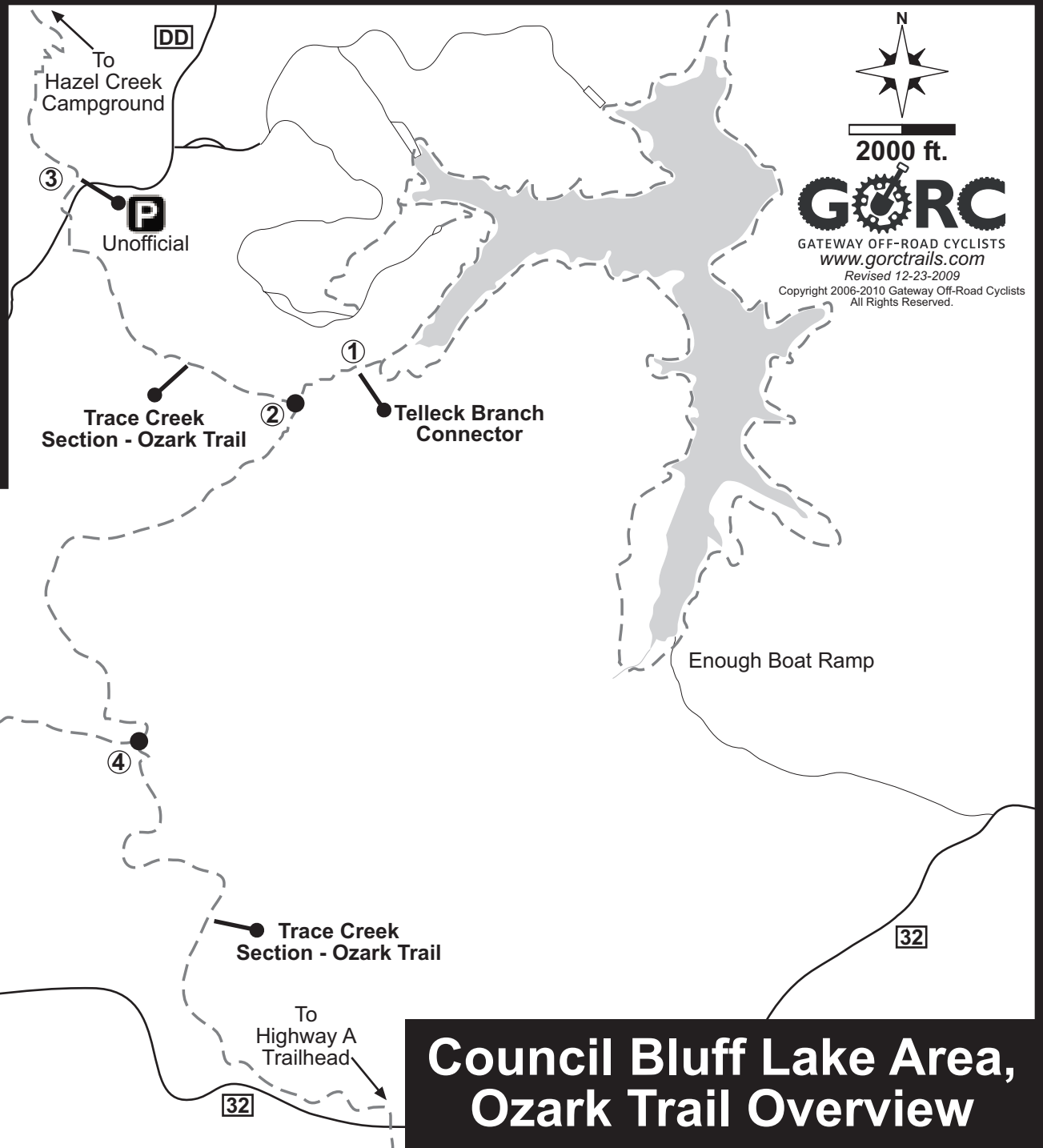
Council Bluff Lake Shore Trail

- ① Telleck Branch Connector is a 0.5 mile trail leading to the Trace Creek and Middle Fork Sections of the Ozark Trail. A reroute was completed in Sept. 2006 which bypasses the area flooded by the beaver dam.
- ② Trace Creek Section of the Ozark Trail begins here. Hazel Creek Campground is ~13 miles north, and the Highway A Trailhead is 10 miles to the south.
- ③ Unofficial parking for the Trace Creek Section.
- ④ Beginning of Middle Fork Section. Highway J Trailhead is 25 miles southwest.
- ⑤ Parking for Middle Fork Section on DD just north of the 32 junction.
